

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

- The articles published in this issue will be selected from the papers accepted for presentation at the Urban Heritage and Tourism: Challenges and Opportunities Conference in Macau 1-3 December, 2009. Presentation at this conference is a pre-requisite for inclusion.
- Papers to be included in the special issue must make a genuine and original contribution to the conference themes, either empirically, with new research materials, theoretically or by re-evaluating existing approaches and understandings. The conference themes include:
 - Managing change in historic urban areas in the face of tourism development
 - Adaptive re-use of urban heritage resources as hospitality venues
 - Heritage interpretation: By whom? For whom?
 - Heritage tourism's contributions to host communities
- Submission of a manuscript to this *Journal* represents a certification on the part of the author(s) that it is an original work, and that neither this manuscript nor a version of it has been published elsewhere nor is being considered for publication elsewhere.
- All articles in this issue will be full-length articles of approximately 5,000 words (15-25 pages, double-spaced). References, citations, and general style of manuscripts for this *Journal* should follow the APA style (as outlined in the latest edition of the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association*). References should be placed in alphabetical order.
- To facilitate the double blind review process, authors are instructed to **include their names, academic titles and degrees, current affiliations, mailing addresses, and contact information (telephone and fax numbers with the country and city code, and e-mail when available) only on the cover page**. Any information which identifies the author(s) should not appear elsewhere in the manuscript.

- Once the manuscript is accepted for publication, at least one of the authors is required to join the membership of Asia Pacific Tourism Association with full membership dues (current membership dues are US\$100 annually, which includes an annual subscription to APJTR).
- **ARTWORKS:** Tables, figures and illustrations must be submitted camera-ready so that they can be used either exactly as they are or after a photographic reduction in size. (Please note that dot-matrix type is often unacceptable for artwork.) If submitted art cannot be used, the Publishing Office reserves the right to redo the art and to charge the author a fee of US\$30.00 per hour for this service. The Publishing Office is not responsible for errors incurred in the preparation of new camera-ready artwork.
